

Today's Radio Highlights

WENDELL L. WILLKIE'S acceptance of the Republican nomination is today's radio news. His widely awaited speech will be heard over all local stations at 4 p. m. At 3 he will be heard from the steps of Elwood High School over WMAL, WJSV and WOL thanking Senator James J. Davis, of Pennsylvania, for his welcoming speech. (As a youth Senator Davis served as a puddler in the steel and tin mills of Elwood and later became city clerk.)

4 p. m., all stations, finds the candidate in Calloway Park, where Representative Charles A. Halleck, of Indiana, who nominated his fellow-Hoosier at the Philadelphia convention, opens the ceremonies by introducing Representative Joseph W. Martin, jr., of Massachusetts, Republican national chairman. Martin will then present nominee Willkie.

5:10, WJSV and WOL—Orren Root, jr., the first Willkie Rooter.

10:45 on WJSV finds CBS presenting editorial comment throughout the Nation on the acceptance speech.
