8:15, WMAL—Dedication of "The Transparent Woman" as a permanent exhibit of the Chicago Museum of Science and Industry before a group of notables.

9:35, WMAL—Arturo Toscanini returns to conduct the NBC Symphony Orchestra for his fourth season. This opening concert will be held in the maestro's well-loved Carnegie Hall and will be a performance of Verdi's "Requiem" with Metropolitan Opera soloists and the Westminster Choir in the choral passages. Zinka Milanov soprano; Bruna Castagna, contralto; Jussi Bjoerling, tenor; and Nicola Moscona, bass, are the soloists. The concert is a benefit for the Alma Gluck Zimbalist Memorial Fund and will also feature Verdi's "Te Deum."
