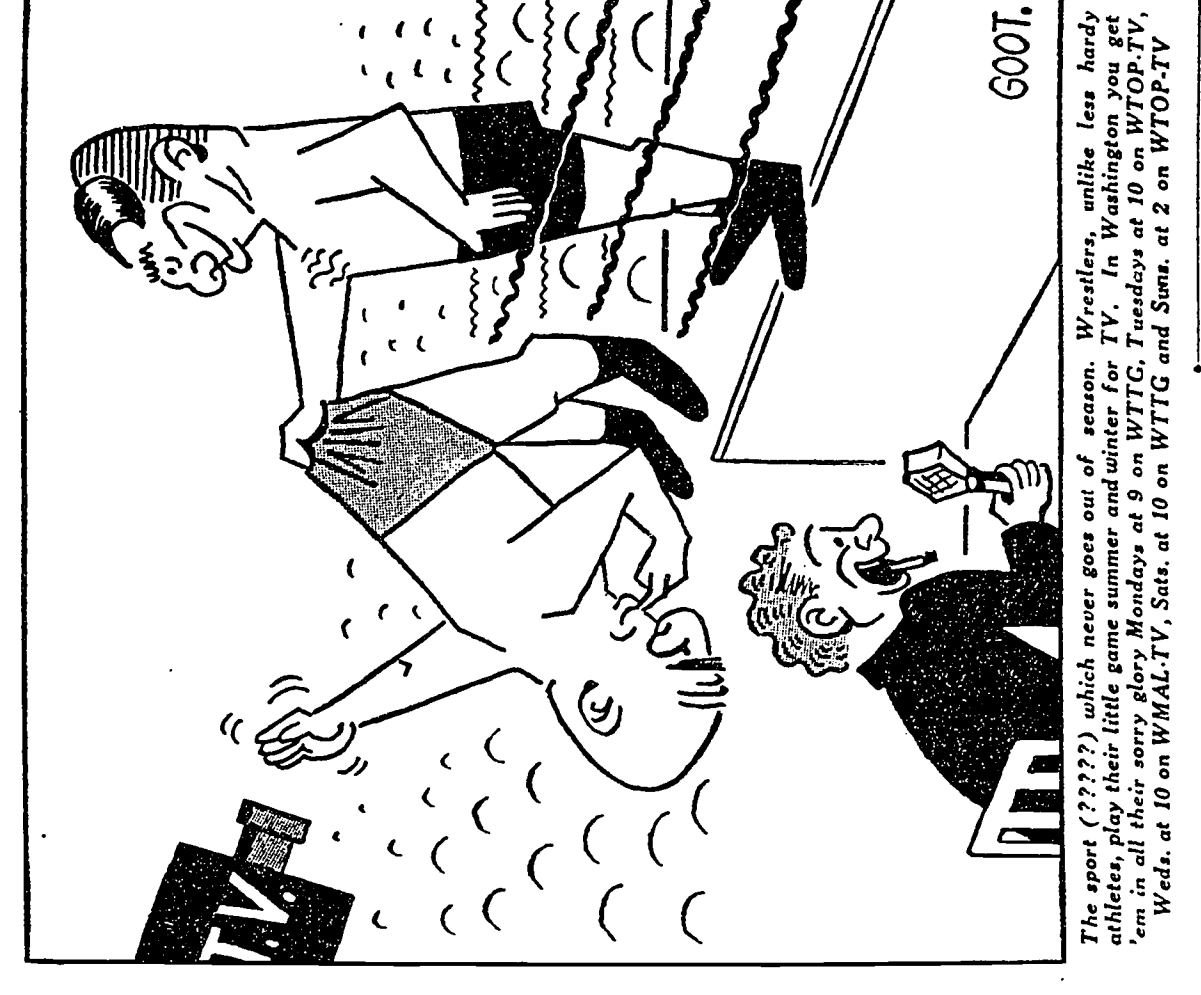

NBC Hears From Baby
 WNBC (like its radio counterpart, WRNC) is currently originating the greatest number of regularly scheduled programs to the NBC network in its history. The station is also topping the list of "leaders" to the network made by other Washington stations to their respective networks.

The combined radio and television network schedule from Washington totals over 12 hours, or 20 minutes per week. WRC originates 43 shows, or an aggregate of 9 hours and 9 minutes; WNBC telecasts 11 shows each week, or a total of 3 hours and 15 minutes air time.

New television originations to the NBC network include "Survival," the official Civilian Defense Administration program, Sundays at 8, and "James Earl Speaks," a Friday half-hour devoted to the former convict. Plans are now under consideration for an hour series of musical programs to start in late July or early August.

JACKIE KALK will take a quickie vacation this summer. He will sail for San Antonio August 9, and return to WTOP-TV on August 12. "You Mr. Burton," in addition to starring on "Young Mr. Burton," Jackie is also co-producing. The new series debuts Sunday, August 26, on WNBC.
