'Hostage' Shows Juvenile Crime

FOR THE FIRST TIME in television history, a newspaper photograph will be the basis of an hour-length dramatic show, tonight at 9 on WVAAL-TV.

Inspired by "Boy Gunman and Hostage," 1948 Pulitzer Award-winning photograph taken by the Boston photograph Frank Cushing, "Hostage" is a dramatization of the juvenile delinquency problem so graphically depicted by Cushing's camera. It is presented on the "Fletcher Five Playhouse."

Cushing's photograph—one youngster trapped in the youngster as hostage in an auto—was used as basis for the script written by Norman Lesling, author of a number of books dealing with juvenile violence.
