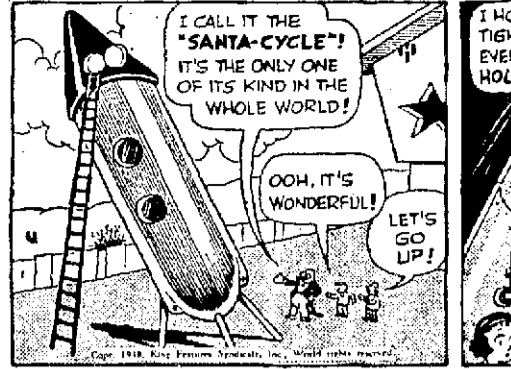

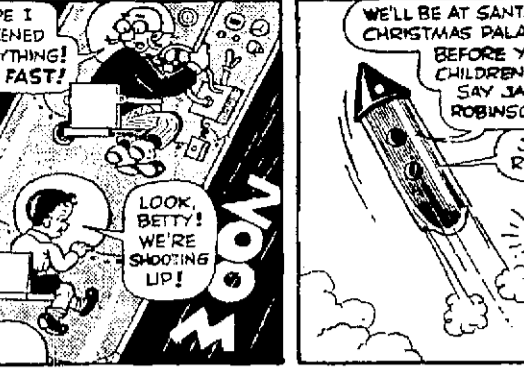

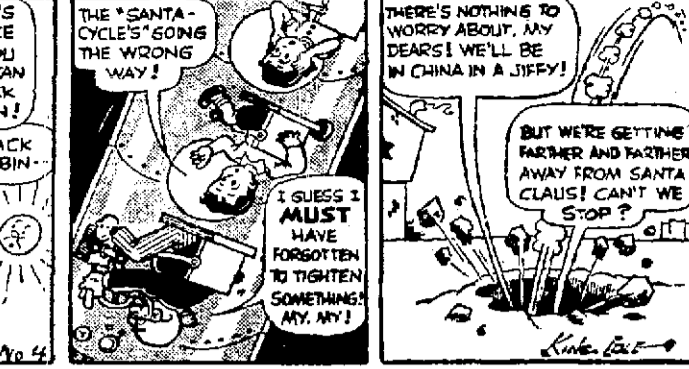

as soon as the ice leaves the lakes and departs when the lakes again freeze. It spends its winters south of the northern limit of open water to Lower California and the Gulf coast.

Loons raise their families while in the north. They make little effort at nest building, often laying their eggs on top of muskrat houses, on top of broken down reeds, and rustles and frequently use the rough nests on dry land a short distance from water.

A young loon takes from three to four years to develop the full plumage of its parents.
