The budget was set at \$750,000. Richard Dix was named as the star. He had an appropriate and expensive supporting east. George Nicholls, Jr., one of the best in the business, was retained to direct. Joe August, the \$750-pcrweek cameraman, signed up to handle the lenses.

The picture was a necord of Sam Houston and his exploits in Texas. Everything had to be extacly right. So the studio hired one of the best-known technical experts in town to handle the his-

He was noted especially for his knowledge of flags. He charged several hundred dollars per week for this knowledge. That was okay with Republic. Accuracy was what it wanted, and hary the expense

The whole troupe went on location near Sonora. Being re-enacted was the battle of the Alamo, with Sam (Richard Dix) Houston in the thick of the fight.

There were lots of battle pernants. regimental streamers and the flags of Mexico, the United States, and Texas. The studio rested easily on the flag situation. It shot the action and left the flags to the technical expert. After the scene was completed

and the actors headed back to Hollywood, a motorcycle courier raced into the studio with the undeveloped film. The darkroom developed it in a hurry and discovered to its surprise, its dismay, and its horror that the Lone Star flag of Texas fluttered from the staff on the roof of the Alamo-

The flag expert lost his job so quickly he still doesn't know what happened. That didn't help matters
