SAN FRANCISCO—(U.R) — The government closed three weeks of testimony Friday designed to show that Harry Bridges, west coast waterfront leader, is a Communist seeking overthrow of the government and should be deported to his native Australia as an undesirable alien.

Counsel for both sides conferred

with examiner James M. Landis on whether Bridges himself should be summoned as the final witness for the government or for the opening witness in his own de-

The government indicated it may call rebuttal witnesses after the defense has rested.

Bridges' attorneys wanted to call a three-day recess in which to prepare their case. Both sides agreed to save a day by writing Communist literature into the records instead of reading it.

Landis recessed the hearing tentatively until Wednesday with the stipulation that if Stanley M. 'Larry" Doyle, subpensed from Minneapolis by the defense, arrives in San Francisco before that, the hearing will be reconvened to take his testimony.




