Bigelow Amendment Petitions Need 60,000 More Names Is Belief

COLUMBUS, O., Aug. 30—(UP) -Reports from 79 of Ohio's 88 counties to the secretary of state ndicated today that signatures on pension amendment would fall about 60,000 short of the required

After all county reports are tabulated sponsors of the amendment

The shortage figures were based upon an anticipated continuance of the same ratio of invalid signatures reported to date. Counties yet to report, however, are Cuyahoga, Hamilton, Athens, Champaign, Jefferson, Madison and

Seventy-nine of the 88 county election boards reported that the necessary 5 per cent quota had been obtained in only 29 of these counties. The law specified that out of the 241,000 signatures needed to qualify a proposed constitutional amendment for the ballot at least 44 counties must be represented with the number of signatures totalling five per cent of the vote cast in the last election for

The amendment would guarantee a monthly income of \$50 for all and \$40 for married couples. It would be financed by a two per cent tax on land valued at \$20,000 an acre, plus an income tax of one-fourth the federal income tax.

Another part of the referendum would reduce to 100,000 the number of signatures needed to put a ballot in the future and to 50,000 the number needed to initiate a
