# Held in Death Crash

The car contained seven passengers and was driven by Ed-ward Lagel, 26. The girl died in a Madison hospital, where her mother is being treated. None of the others was injured.

# Dies Warns of Fascist Racketeers

WASHINGTON - (U.P.) - The house committee on unAmerican activities Thursday night cautioned American citizens against heeding the appeals of "peewee Hitlers" whom the committee described as Fascist racketeers seeking to change the U.S. form of government.

In a preliminary report on its inquiry into Fascist activities, the committee said numerous Nazi and Fascist groups are at work in the United States and it feels obliged to warn "all our citizens against aping the methods of foreign dic-

"Like Adolf Hitler," the report said, "these American Fascists make their chief appeal to the basest forms of race hatred. Like Hitler, they promise to deliver this country from the menace of Communism. Like Hitler, they heap seern upon the institutions of democracy. Like Hitler, they urge the short cuts of force and violence. Asserting the committee's evidence showed widespread cooperation between about 50 of these Fascist groups, and several attempts to create a permanent federation, the report said the search for a "man on horseback" to lead
