TWO DIVORCE ACTIONS FILED Two divorce suits were filed Wednesday with Clerk of Courts J. Leonard Schnabel.

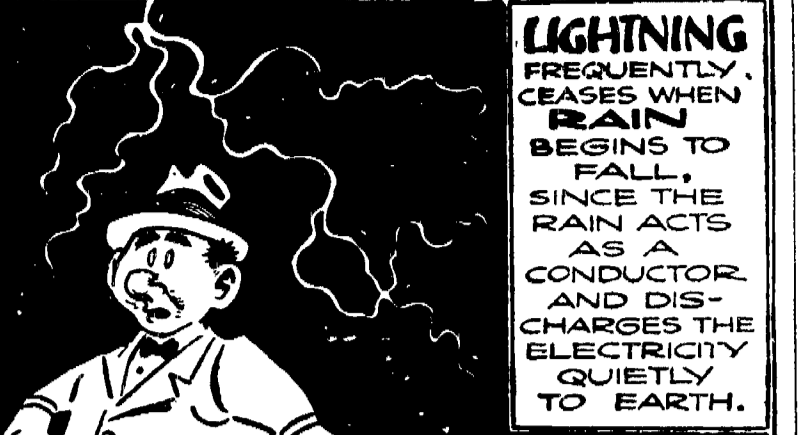

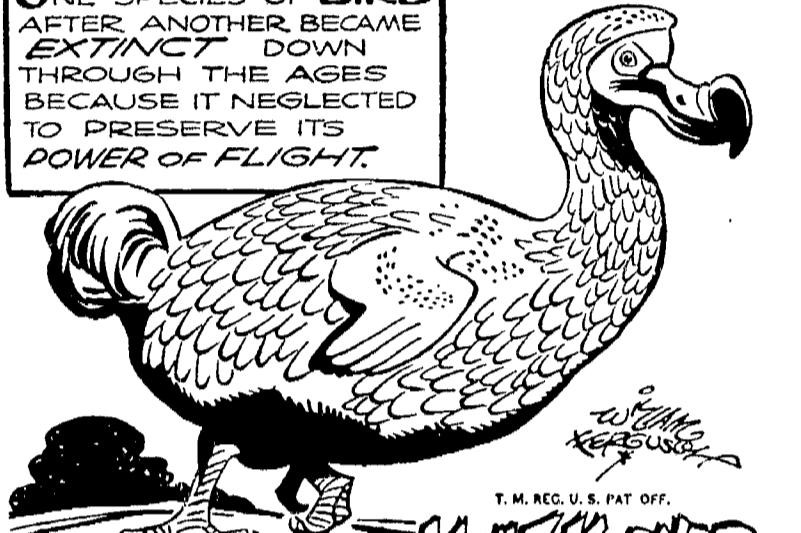

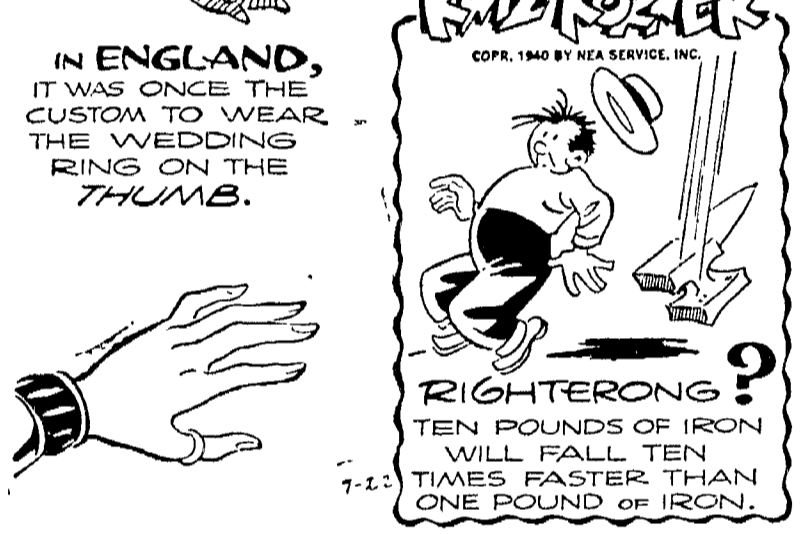

WEST OHIO GAS RATE APPROVED BY COMMISSION The Ohio Gas Co. Wednesday was authorized by the Ohio Industrial Commission to retain for the balance of the year its temporary optional industrial tariff in Lima and the Lima metropolitan district.

Frank L. Pringle, manager of the West Ohio, said the company has only two Lima industries qualifying for the service which is subject to interruptions which may occur in supplying all other customers. He viewed the commission's action as a formality which has been followed at six-month intervals for the past several years.

The rates follow: first 200,000 cubic feet, 60 cents per 1,000; next 200,000 cubic feet, 55 cents per thousand; next 1,600,000 cubic feet, 50 cents per thousand, and excess at 45 cents per thousand with a minimum charge of \$20.
