Industry, Labor Must Cooperate, Patterson Warns

BOSTON, Mass. (U.P.) - Assistant Secretary of War Robert P. Patterson said Saturday night that industry and labor must cooperate if the nation is to remain in time to defend itself properly. "Speaking before the Harvard Alumni assn., Patterson said that the greatest disaster for America would be not to awaken in time to the seriousness of the nation's position in the world of today. "Do sensible men in such a predicament stop production because of a quarrel over wages? Do they resist priorities urgently required by the needs of the army on the plea that some competing civilian activity of their own might have a trifling value for national defense? Do they hold back from vigorous effort because they are not sure what the effect may be on their business after the time of stress may have passed? "No-not if they appreciate the gravity of the situation. Failure to appreciate that gravity is the only thing we have to worry about. The greatest evil that can befall us is not to awaken in time to the critical seriousness of our position and to the tremendous magnitude of the effort we are making."
