RECORD WHEAT HARVEST SEEN IN HARDIN-CO

(Lima News Bureau) KENTON, July 11—A bumper wheat crop is anticipated in Hardin-co this summer as wheat, now being harvested, begins to pour into local grain elevators. Allen Martin who yesterday combined 15 acres of wheat on the Martin farm southwest of here, reported 50 bushels to the acre for the first time since before 1917. The harvest brought 758 bushels and 10 pounds of wheat which made 50 bushels and 22 pounds to the acre.

Also reported was 39 bushels to the acre, raised on 21 acres on the F. J. Laubis farm in Dudley; 37 bushels to the acre on the Arthur Harrison farm in Dudley; and 25 bushels to the acre on the Dan Holliman farm in Goshen; where 911 bushels were raised on 25 acres.

The deep purple blossom was somewhat larger than the white flower of the Calla lily, which it resembles in appearance. McVeigh said the plant was 2 years old and bloomed for the first time. The so-called "black lily" is a common name for either of two members of the Fritillaria family which have deep purple petals.

MAN BURNED IN GAS EXPLOSION

Van Wert Filling Station Operator Is Victim As Naptha Ignites

(Special To The Lima News) VAN WERT, July 11—Henry King of this city, owner and operator of a Shell Oil gasoline station on Shannon-st. is believed recovering at Van Wert-co hospital from severe burns received Thursday evening when naphtha gas became ignited. The station, constructed of stucco, was gutted by the flames. King has first degree burns on both hands, surface burns to his back and face and part of his hair was consumed. According to city firemen, King was drawing the gas from a 100-gallon barrel inside the station. It is believed that some of the fuel splashed against the container, struck an electric fan nearby and was ignited by a spark from the motor. King ran outside the station and managed to extinguish the flames in his clothing by rolling in grass.
