



TO ALL RESIDENTS OF BATH TOWNSHIP In previous years the Foard of rustees of Bath Township have hade arrangements with the City of Lima whereby the Fire Department furnishes fire protection to residents of Bath Township. In order to secure this protection it costs the township a flat rate of two hundred dellars plus flfty dollars for each run made.

In a few cases the township has been able to collect the cost of the fire run from insurance companies, insuring the property to which the run was made. However, in most cases the cost of the run has been paid in full by the township. During January and February of this year there have been five runs at a cost of flfty dollars each or a total of two hundred and flfty dollars. if Lima whereby the Fit


