All manner of peculiar devices must be used at times to accomplish that desideratum Upon rare occasions it is necessary to ruff a trick with a high trump and thus put yourself in a position where it is absolutely necessary, to try a finesse which previously seemed non-existent. By creating the risk of losing that finesse, you also create the only possible choice to make your contract.

He ruffed the diamond 3 with the space 8, then cashed the dummy's spade K and Q. Unable to get back to his own hand except with a ruff, he used his spade A on a heart lead, cashed his top two diamonds and then was through, having to lose the last three tricks.

If West had used one of dummy's high trumps, say the Q, to ruff the diamond 3, he could have raked in the other high trump there, then could have hazarded his all on a finesse of the spade 10, which would have won, could have dropped the last hostile trumps with the A, and then could have completed the hand with two high diamonds and three clubs. It was an opportunity for very pretty play, such as seldom is offered in a neater form.


