15 Senators Ask Hershey to 'Freeze' Workers on Farms

WASHINGTON (UP)—Fifteen senators today "sang" for selective service headquarters the old World War I song: "How You Gonna Keep 'em Down on the Farm."

The War Production Board ordered all large gold mines—between 200 and 300 in the west—shut down within 60 days in an effort to free an estimated 3,000 to 4,000 workers for jobs in more essential mining industries.

These developments in farm and mine labor may spur administration action on manpower problems. But the present outlook is that action may not come until after the first of the year.
