Rep. Robert F. Jones of Lima will share speaking honors with the presidential candidate of 1940, coming here from Washington for the occasion.

Both the senior and representative will discuss national issues in their relationship to the coming state and congressional elections.

A handful of Republican leaders will entertain Taft and Jones at dinner following his arrival from Findlay, after which the group will adjourn to the high school auditorium.

FERGUSON GIVES CHALLENGE AT KALIDA RALLY

(Lima News Bureau) KALIDA, Oct. 16—Joseph T. Ferguson, auditor of state, during an address here at a Democratic rally challenged Gov. John W. Bricker to hire "a reputable firm of certified public accountants to investigate records and expenditures covered by his (Bricker's) 1941 report."

Ferguson was the principal speaker at the rally which opened the party's campaign for the Nov. 3 election. He declared that if he want the governor to release for public inspection a detailed account of the accountants' findings which I know will prove Bricker's claims to economy are false and that, in truth, he is the greatest spendthrift governor in the history of Ohio.

Ferguson charged that the Bricker administration was stunned by his report issued last week in which the auditor claimed that the governor's administration has spent a total of \$339,817,296—the highest ever piled up by a state administration.

Feid E. Warren of Leipsic, Democratic candidate for congress from the Fifth Ohio district, also spoke. He told the group that he will guard the interests of farmers, small businessmen and private citizens alike—to the best of his ability—if he is elected.

Candidates for Putnam-co. office Nov. 3 were introduced by Richard E. Laudick, county Democratic chairman who presided at the session.

ORDER TO CLEAN LAGOON GIVEN

(Special To The Lima News) ST. MARYS, Oct. 16—Orders to clean out the lagoon at the northern corner of Lake St. Marys have been issued by W. R. Heck, state director of inland lakes and parks. He authorized John Sunderland, lake foreman, to use the state dredge in cleaning the channel and to build up banks on each side of the lagoon. The banks later will be levelled off and the one next to the road will be a parking ground for automobiles.

Old Injunction Suit Is Heard

Judge Neal Lora Friday was hearing, without a jury, the four-year-old injunction action of the Union Service Corp. against the City of Lima, water department in Allen-co common pleas court.

The action was filed May 6, 1938, by the Union Service Corp., parent concern of the Lima Ice and Coal Co., to prohibit the city from stopping water service during a dispute over a bill for \$209.09.

Up for final hearing on the injunction and adjustment of the differences in money, three witnesses had been called when court recessed at noon. They were Harvey W. Kesler, Lima manager for the concern; City Treasurer B. E. Tabler and Clyde Widmark, chief engineer for the Union Service Corp.

MINSTER SCRAP DRIVE NETS 10 TONS OF METAL

(Special To The Lima News) MINSTER, Oct. 16—Several huge piles of scrap metal, weighing an estimated 10 tons, stacked in the Minster school yard, attested today to success by pupils of the high school in cooperation in the Auglaize-co drive for old iron and steel for the war effort.

A house-to-house canvass by schoolboys using village trucks yielded steel beer kegs, bed springs, bedsteads, oldtime stoves, water tanks, antiquated irons, structural steel pieces and other items.

Old cannon balls in the village park have been hauled away and the heavy Civil war cannon itself has been donated. In addition, 150 tons of steel rails will be removed from Main-st and sent to the nation's steel mills.
