Herodotus Describes Test to Discover "Most Ancient Race".

AS THE months passed, the crowds which listened to Herodotus grew larger. His fame spread over Athens, and everyone seemed to want to know about his adventures.

The great traveler had written so many notes that he could not read them all in an afternoon, or in a dozen afternoons. People found that they could hear something different each day.

Two years after he had come to their city, the Athenians voted a prize to Herodotus, a prize of 10 talents! That was a big sum, equal in modern money to from \$10,000 to \$12,000.

Tales of Egypt were among the favorite topics of Herodotus. Let us listen to him talking about that

"The Egyptians used to believe that they were the most ancient of all people, but one of their kinds made a test. He took two babies and placed them under the care of a herdsman.

"The herdsman was told to take good care of the babies, to provide them with shelter and plenty of food. But he was never to speak to them, and no one else was to utter a word which they could hear. They were to be placed in a special cottage.

'The object was to find out what word the infants would first speak, not counting their early babbling sounds. The herdsmen followed his orders, and two years later heard a clear word from them. As he came to the door of their cottage, they ran to him and shouted. "Becos!
