





There were 138 nests in the tree, and all of them hung from branches more than 70 feet above the ground. One nest had a length of six feet, and near the bottom of it was a "nest-

tree, however, had 50 nests hanging

ing chamber" one foot wide. Giant orioles are safe from most enemies, but they have their troubles. Certain other birds, known as "rice grackles," like to lay their eggs in the hanging nests. The orioles keep chasing the rice grackles away, but sometimes one of them slips into a nest and lays an egg where another bird may do the work of hatching.
