is turned up here and there, the millions of pounds obtained each year are taken from ore. The silver is mixed with other minerals, and there is trouble in getting it out.

One way of taking silver from ore was worked out by a Spaniard almost four centuries ago. It came into widespread use in Mexico.

That method called for the crushing of the ore with a large boulder or other heavy object which could be rolled over it. Later the crushed ore was placed in a small "pond," usually from eight to 12 feet wide. When well mixed 6-10 with water, it became a smooth mud. made of solid, well-polished silver.
