

Show At State Is A Warning To Those Who Talk Too Much

What a few words of idle chatter and bits of unimportant information can do to wreck a carefully planned military operation is vividly pictured in "The Next of Kin," a thought-provoking warning to those who talk too much. It commences Thursday at the State theatre with J. Edgar Hoover presenting the prologue and epilogue. "The Youngest Profession" is the co-feature. Showing for the last times Wednesday are "Hit the Ice" and "Honeymoon Lodge."

Music, glamor, dancing and skating highlight the fun and frolic in the gay musical hit, "Wintertime," starring Sonja Henie, and now at the Quilna theatre. The cast includes Jack Oakie, Cesar Romero and Carole Landis.

Adventure and romance run neck and neck in the new film, "The Adventures of Tartu," which stars Robert Donat and Valerie Hobson at the Ohio theatre. The story depicts the adventures of a special British agent, "Tartu."

One of the principal characters will be played by Hobart Cavanaugh, who is one of the most versatile actors on the screen today. He plays such widely diversified roles as quick talking wise guys, timid hen pecked husbands, zealous drunks and mystery men, and it is to his great credit, that he is always in demand by every studio, none of which has ever "typed" him.

George Sherman directed and produced "A Scream In the Dark" and leading man is Robert Lowery, with Marie McDonald playing opposite. Also in the cast are Edward Brophy, Wally Vernon and Elizabeth Russell.

In keeping with wartime film policies, studios are conserving these days. In the new musical, "Wintertime," starring Sonja Henie, which is now at Quilna theatre, featuring Jack Oakie, Cesar Romero, Carole Landis and Woody Herman and his band, the studio made use of the 88 tons of snow which decorated the landscape in "The Moon Is Down," which originally came from the sets of "How Green Was My Valley."

After the finishing touches were placed on "The Moon Is Down," the snow was carefully sifted clean and placed in sacks in the studio prop department. The temperature of the storage room had to be rather warm to preserve the so-called snow.

Movie snow, in case you didn't know, is composed of powdered gypsum. Before the war the studios could have as many tons per annum as their winter pictures demanded. Not so today, because the armed forces are demanding all the available supply.

Since the army unquestionably comes first the studio faced a crisis. They solved it by laundering the snow.

LEND-LEASE TO BE EXTENDED
