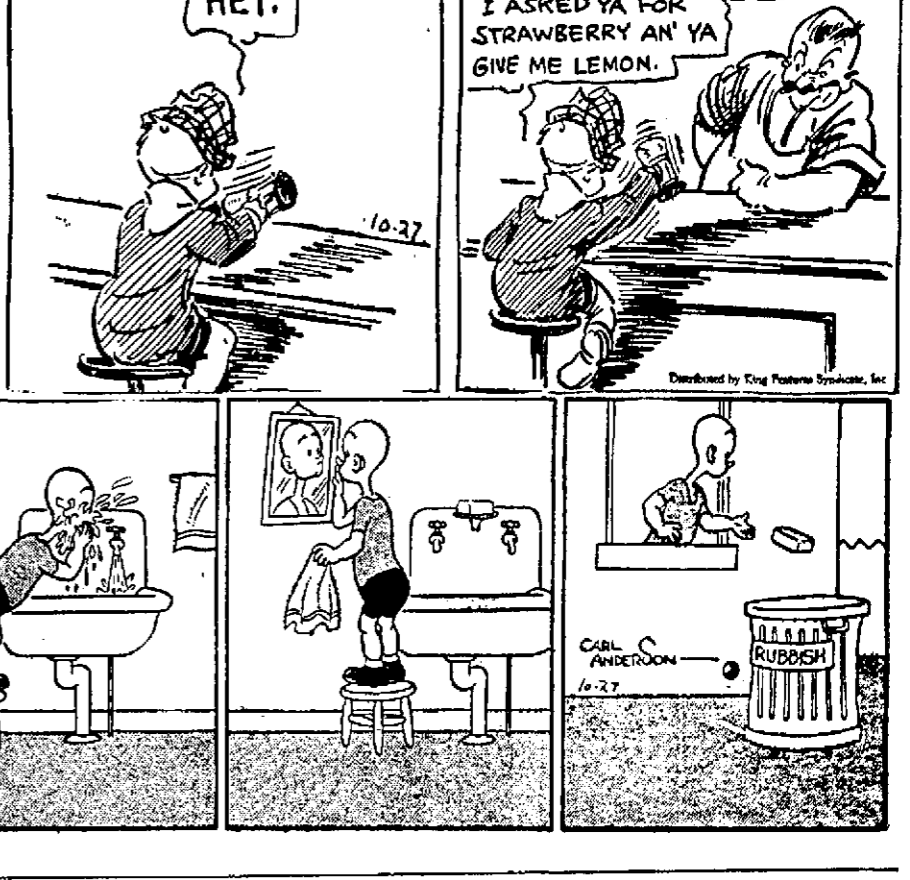
Eau Claire Men Admit Kidnaping
