

Hedy Lamarr Stars In "Casablanca" Monday

"Casablanca," starring Hedy Lamarr, Alan Ladd, Ernest ("Cabin in the Sky") Whitman and John Loder will be aired Monday at 8 p. m. EST over WABC. This program, originally scheduled for Jan. 17 was postponed for the inauguration of the Fourth War Loan Drive.

Vox Pop, one of radio's most effective shows, traveling America to bring listeners on-the-spot interviews with self-sacrificing men and women fighting to defeat the enemy, will be in New Haven, Conn., center of small arms manufacture, for the Morlay broadcast. Paiks Johnson and Warren Hull will take their microphone into the huge gun and ammunition plant of Winchester Repeating Arms Co., and will be on WABC at 7 p. m., EST, with skilled employees producing the famous Garand rifle, and who originated and developed the sensational U. S. Carbine, mighty midget of World War II.

Pat O'Brien, Ruth Warwick and Robert Ryan share the spotlight, when the "Screen Guild Players" present "The Iron Major," based on the life of Major Cavanaugh, famed Fordham football coach, on Monday at 9 p. m. over WABC. Ezio Pinza, Metropolitan Opera basso, is joined by two younger Met singers, Soprano Christina Carroll and Tenor Donald Dame, as guests on the "Great Artists Series" Monday over WEEF at 8 p. m., EST. Both Miss Carroll and Donald Dame were received with critical praise when they made their debuts at the Metropolitan this season. GERMAN ATTACK ON ATLANTIC CONVOY ROUTED

LONDON, Jan. 24.—(AP)—An attack on an Atlantic convoy by German U-Boats and by planes using glider bombs was "completely frustrated" by British escort ships and U. S. and British aircraft during a four-day battle that started midway between the Azores and Portugal, it was announced today.

One U-boat was known to have been sunk, two were believed probably sunk and others were damaged. Several enemy planes were shot down. Every effort of the Germans to organize a concentrated attack was defeated, a joint admiralty-air military communique said.

The struggle was broken up into a series of day and night engagements, starting when 15 long-range Nazi bombers launched glider bombs at the convoy about 600 miles west of the Azores, France.

Two of the convoy ships were damaged, but the attackers were driven off by Allied planes operating from Gibraltar and the new bases in the Azores.

RATIONING TOKENS BEING CHECKED

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.—(AP)—The Truman senate investigating committee is checking up on the new OPA rationing tokens being manufactured in Cincinnati to learn whether they will seriously interfere with slot machines, automatic candy and gum vending devices and other such equipment.

Rudolph Helley, executive assistant counsel of the committee, said the study was undertaken at request of a locker manufacturer. He said an organization representing transit companies also was concerned about the degree to which the rationing tokens might be used as street car and bus fares.

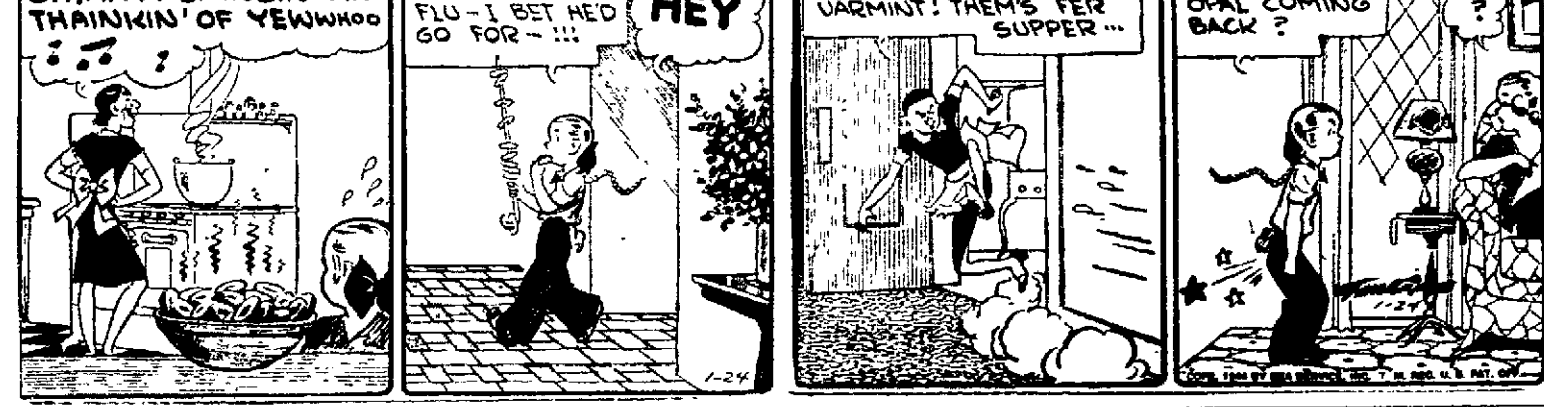

NEWARK REPAIR SHOP PLANNED FOR ARMY USE

COLUMBUS, O., Jan. 24.—(AP)—An Army repair shop for reclamation and rebuilding of ordnance material will be established soon at Newark, O., Maj. Gen. James L. Collins, commanding general of the Fifth Service Command, announced today.

The installation will be one of a chain of similar units being set up in various parts of the country as centers for reconditioning of ordnance equipment that has been damaged or out of work either in combat overseas or in training activities in this country, the officer said.

General Collins estimated the repair base essentially would employ several hundred civilian workers and would have a capacity for reconditioning about 30 engines a day.

The shop will be operated in the north plant of the Newark Stove Co. which has been leased by the Army. Maj. Paul J. Lamb has been designated commanding officer of the shop. Lt. Col. H. E. Stout, Fifth Service command ordnance officer, said.

MAYOR KILLED BY AUTO

CLARINGTON, O., Jan. 24.—(AP)—An automobile whose driver did not stop struck and killed nine-term Mayor John Wesley Rose, 73, who also was a justice of the peace and correspondent for Ohio valley newspapers.
