QUILNA
 Federal authorities paid unconscious tribute to the realism of the epic story of the (Construction Battalion, "The Fighting Seabees" which is now showing at the Quilna theatre.

It occurred when a Seabee took 16 mm color pictures of the battle sequence, sent it to the laboratory to be developed and was cutly informed a few days later that the pictures had been confiscated.

Battle scenes were so realistic that laboratory technicians reported to Federal officers, and it was believed that the scenes were shot during actual battle in the South Pacific. The Seabee was called in by his commanding officer and explained that it was only a Hollywood product and not the real thing. To back up his argument, the Seabee pointed out the pictures in the film of John Wayne and Dennis O'Keefe proving that he wasn't harboring contraband film. The pictures were released to him but the laboratory technicians declare that anyone might be fooled by the stark realism of the combat scenes.

INVASION RULE FOR HOLLAND BEING PLANNED

WASHINGTON, May 17—(INS)—An immediate post invasion policy for Holland, intended to prevent a "blood-bath" of German officials and Dutch Quislings, in which innocent people also might suffer was outlined today by the Netherlands embassy.

This policy is expressed in an agreement already drawn up in London between the Dutch British and American governments to be signed within a few days. Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower will sign for the United States.

It designates a new agency known as the "Militaire Gezag," or military government, which will go into Holland with the invasion forces, and will rule the country under a special state of military siege.

Dutch officials explained that the first moment of invasion and liberation is the most dangerous moment for the orderly conduct of affairs.

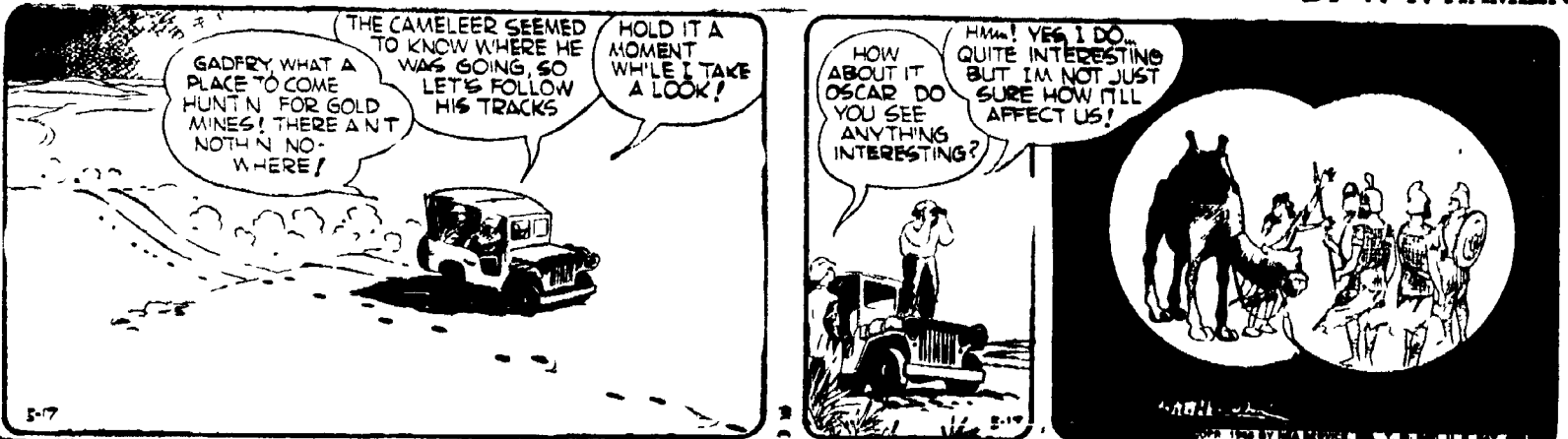

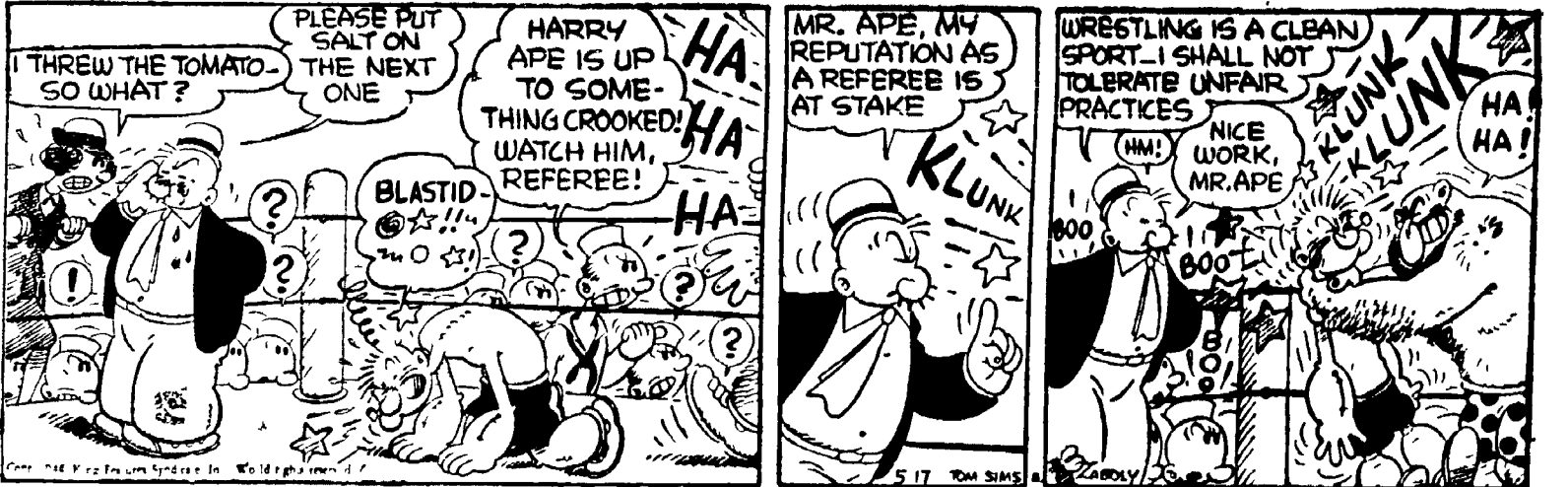

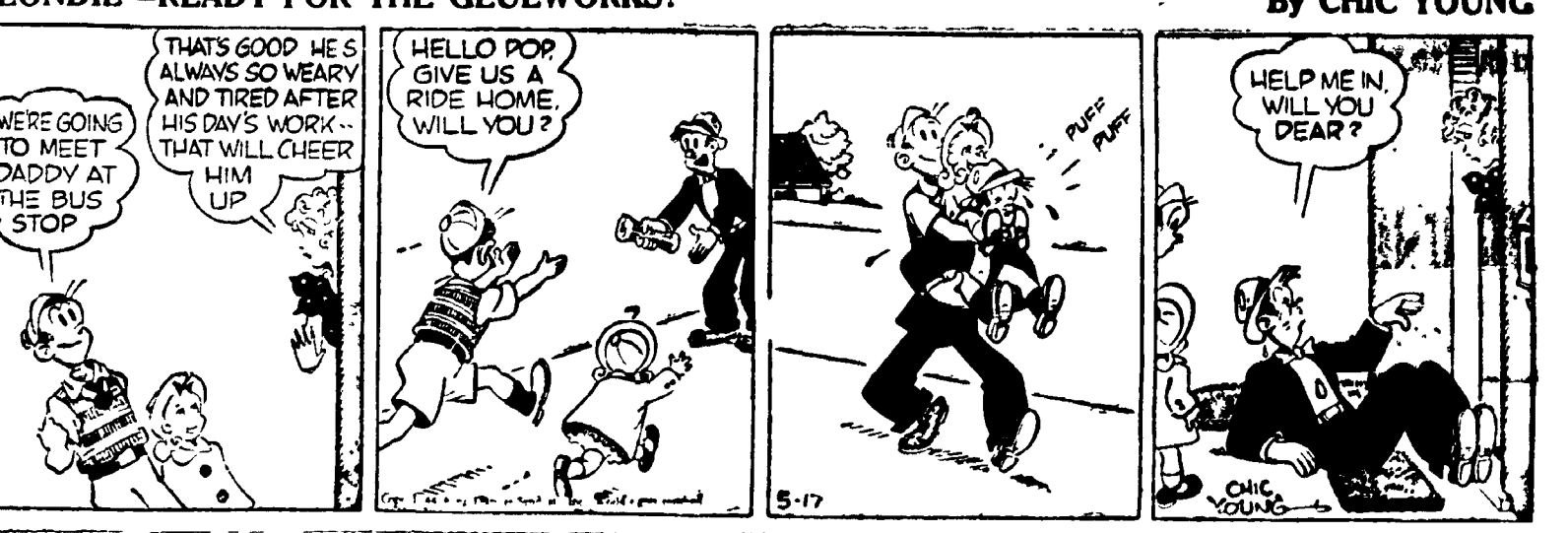

NOTED WRITER IS KILLED ON ITALIAN FRONT

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN NAPLES, May 17—(AP)—Fredrick Faust, war correspondent for Harper's magazine and better known under the pen name of Max Brand as a fiction and movie writer, was killed in action Thursday night on the Lower Garigliano sector, it was disclosed today.

Faust, who wrote under four other pen names, was creator of the Dr. Kildare stories which had wide popularity in motion pictures. He wrote 85 books and also quantities of fiction and became known as "King of the Pulps."

Faust was killed the opening night of the Fifth Army offensive. He previously had been reported wounded. He went into the opening assault with the troops only a short time after arriving in this theatre.
