GOP PROSPECTS REPORTED GOOD IN TWO STATES

NEW YORK, July 22—(AP)—Herbert Brownell, Jr., chairman of the Republican National committee, said today he had received reports of "tremendous enthusiasm" and "bright prospects" for the Dewey-Bricker ticket in Oregon and Massachusetts, and that electoral votes of the entire northwest might go to the Republicans. Brownell said at a press conference that the reports concerning the election chances of Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York and Gov. John Bricker of Ohio as GOP presidential and vice presidential candidates came from U. S. Sen. Sinclair Weeks of Massachusetts and Ralph Cake, national committeeman from Oregon. Brownell said he would leave New York for Washington, D. C., tomorrow. Monday he will make his first visit to the Washington headquarters of the Republican National committee, he said.

RECORD IS SET IN ERECTION OF DETROIT HOMES

CLEVELAND, July 22—(AP)—The Federal Public Housing Authority's regional office reported today that a new record in production of housing for war workers was established in Detroit when the Cunningham-Rudy Co. erected 285 single-family mobile dwellings in 37 working days. "This speed results," said the FPHA, "from use of an expandible mobile house developed by FPHA technicians and engineers of the Palace Corp. of Flint, Mich., manufacturers of the houses. Each house, large enough for a family of four or five, is completely fabricated in a factory and trucked to the erection site where foundations are ready to receive it and utility services are ready for connection with the house."

FARLEY WILL SUPPORT TICKET

CHICAGO, July 22—(UP)—Former Chairman James A. Farley of the Democratic national committee will support President Roosevelt and his running mate, Sen. Harry S. Truman of Missouri, in the forthcoming campaign, even though he is opposed to a fourth term. Farley, here as a delegate from New York, said so in this statement he issued last night: "I have been opposed on principle to a third or fourth presidential term. For that reason I voted for the nomination of Sen. Harry F. Byrd of Virginia. Having participated in the proceedings of the convention, I accept its decision and will support the party nominee." Farley voted for Byrd for the presidential nomination.

Rainfall Now Can't Cut Ohio Drought Loss

COLUMBUS, O., July 22—(AP)—Adequate rainfall during the remainder of the growing season would not aid crops already damaged by drought, the Ohio State University Agricultural extension staff reported today, adding that even immediate rainfall could no longer produce better than ordinary corn and soybean yields. Ohio farmers planted about eight per cent more corn this year than in 1943 when the harvest was approximately 173,000,000 bushels. The U. S. July 1 crop report estimated Ohio corn production for 1944 at 186,053,000 bushels, but agricultural experts now anticipate a decided downward revision in that estimate. Crop prospects in other areas are better than in Ohio, where lack of rainfall still is reducing the outlook for good soybean and corn crops. Ohio will produce this year only 60 per cent of the 1943 rye and barley yield, but the oat crop is expected to be 34 per cent greater. The Ohio soybean acreage is one per cent higher than a year ago, but any present estimate on yields would be "a wild guess," the report concluded.

CAR POOLING TO BE URGED BY OPA

DALLAS, Tex., July 22—(AP)—The regional office of the Office of Price Administration said today war price and rationing boards over the nation have been instructed after Aug. 1, to refuse all supplemental gasoline rations to B and C cardholders who do not conform to certain car-pooling regulations. Supplemental gasoline will not be given drivers who use their cars for home-to-work driving and cannot show that they belong to a car pool and are regularly carrying a full car load, the OPA stated. Persons who use their automobiles for business purposes would be excepted, the agency stated.
