YANKS MAY QUIT BURMA AFTER ROAD IS OPENED

WASHINGTON, Nov. 27—(AP) The United States apparently intends to withdraw its comparatively small contingent of combat troops from India and Burma when the Burma road is reopened. It considers the Southeast Asia theatre essentially a sphere of British interest.

An indication of the plan is contained in a dispatch from India by Associated Press Correspondent Preston Grover who reports that the Allied advance in Northern and Western Burma has been so rapid that the end of America's main fighting commitment in this theatre is almost in sight. Grover says the commitment was to reopen the Burma road to China.

A general opinion in military circles here is that the primary commitment at the outset was and still remains one made to China. Whatever benefits the British derive from purely military operations is incidental to the paramount project of getting help to China.

Britain's concern, on the other hand, is more immediate—making absolute the security of India from Japanese attack, regaining Singapore and freeing Burma and the rest of Malaya.

YANKEE ACE IS NAZI PRISONER

MISSOULA, Mont., Nov. 27—(AP)—Tears and laughter echoed thru the Zemke household last night upon notification that Col. Hubert Zemke of Missoula, leading American ace in Europe who has been missing in action since Oct. 30, was safe and a prisoner of war in Germany.

"We were tearful, then hilariously happy," his pretty, dark-haired wife said.

"All along we knew that we'd hear from him again—we never gave up hope," she laughed. "Of course," she added proudly, "you see, he wasn't shot down and we have enough faith in his ability to take care of himself in a disabled plane."

BURNS SUFFERED IN FIRE FATAL TO GIRL

SPRINGFIELD, O., Nov. 27—(AP) —Two-year-old Patricia Parks who was carried from her burning home by a neighbor Saturday died yesterday of burns suffered in the blaze. Clarence Brakewell carried the girl and her three-year-old brother, Daniel, from the house. The boy also was burned critically.

Fire Chief Grover L. Fieck said the fire started while the children were playing with matches. They were the children of Pat and Mrs. William Parks. The father is serving overseas with the Army.

HILLMAN PLANS CONTINUATION OF NCPAC UNIT

CHICAGO, Nov. 27—(AP)—Sidney Hillman today announced plans to continue the National Citizens' Political Action Committee, with emphasis on small business to "guard free enterprise" against monopoly.

Hillman, chairman of the NCPAC, told a press conference the executive committee of the group has voted to name a sub-committee to meet within 60 days and determine the form of the organization, method of financing, and means of cooperating with other groups.

Hillman said the NCPAC, in its political education program, will stress cooperation with other groups, especially farmers, small business, churches, arts and sciences, and both political parties.

"It will place emphasis on small business in order to guard free enterprise by obtaining proper legislation to prevent monopoly," he added.

He termed the NCPAC an organization for "clearing it with the people."

Hillman, also chairman of the CIO-PAC, said the committee had hopes the NCPAC will be bigger than the CIO group. He emphasized the two organizations would be separate, with a "very minority" representation from the CIO.

He said the organization would be financed thru voluntary contributions.
