# FORMER CASE SCHOOL OFFICER DIES AT 86

CLEVELAND, Dec. 20 — (INS) —Dr. Eckstein Case, for 50 years secretary-treasurer of the Case School of Applied Science in Cleveland, died at his home early today after a long illness. He was 86.

Born in Carlyle, Ill., the educator was a member of the 1880 class at the United States Military Academy. He received his bachelor of laws degree from the University of Michigan in 1884, and after being admitted to the Ohio bar, practiced in Cleveland.

Dr. Case first became connected with the school, endowed by a cousin, in 1887 and served until his retirement in 1937. He also was active in other educational and civic affairs.

Survivors include two nephews, Warren Case of Toledo, and Dr. Leonard C. Scott of New Orleans, La., and a niece, Miss Mary Case of Toledo.

Altho funeral plans were not completed, burial was set to be held in Carlyle.

# MAN CONFESSES, DENIES SLAYINGS

COVINGTON, Ky., Dec. 20 — (INS) — Slaying of two Northern Kentucky taxicab drivers were confessed and then denied within 24 hours today by John Hammack, 21, who was held in Covington jail on a charge of being a fugitive from justice pending further investigation.

Arrested in Cincinnati Thursday in connection with a housebreaking, Hammack confessed a part in the fatal shooting near London, Ky., on Oct. 7 of Vadus Richardson, 34-year-old Kentucky state highway patrolman. In a three-page confession made at nearby Hazard, Ky., Hammack implicated two women and another man. Later the confession was denied and he absolved the two women.

Hammack also said he killed Paul Martin, Newcity cab driver, near Covington last Sept. 2. Eight days later, he said he fatally wounded Otis Hudson, another Covington cabbie. Hudson was slain in his cab on a Covington street.
