15 UNION MEN CONVICTED IN WEIRTON CASE

NEW CUMBERLAND, W. Va., Feb. 2 (AP)—A jury yesterday convicted 15 members of the CIO United Steelworkers' union of unlawful seditious acts March 30 while solving men erupting at the gate of the Weirton Steel Co. at nearby Weirton, W. Va.

The jury deliberated 3 1/2 hours in returning a verdict in the second trial to grow out of efforts of the CIO union to supplant the Weirton Independent Union Inc. as bargaining representative for the plant.

Judge J. H. Brennan said he would act Thursday on a motion for a new trial filed by defense counsel.

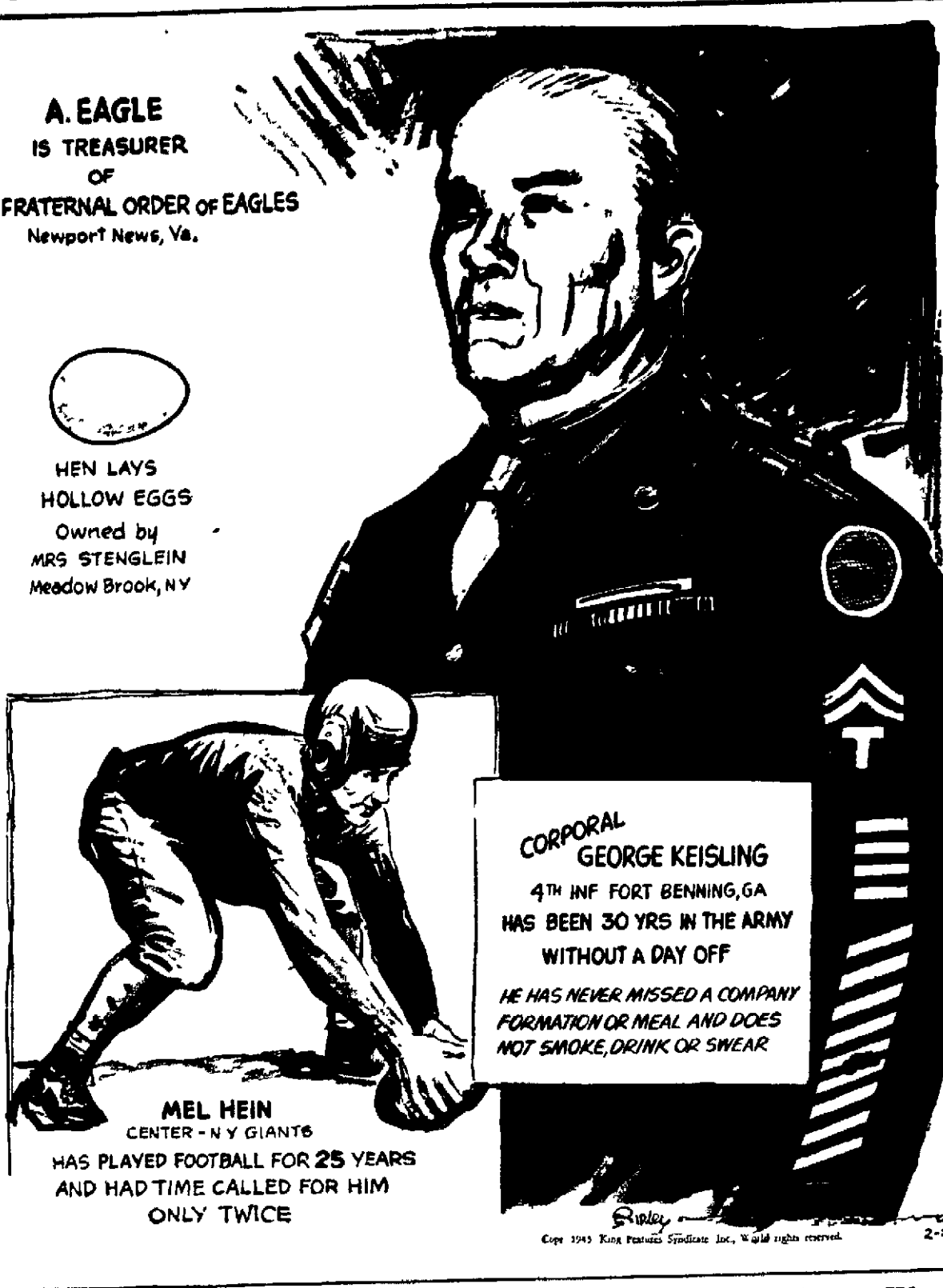

Bataan Rescue Brings Joy To Ohio Families

(By The Associated Press) Thirteen Ohio families today shared long-anticipated happiness. Their loved ones were among the 513 men freed from a Japanese camp on Luzon by daring American rangers.

Now they are awaiting personal word from sons and brothers who participated in the courageous stand at Bataan and Corregidor. Their big hope is that the liberated men will get furloughs.

The 13 Ohioans freed were Pfc. Clarence W. Bower of Mt. Sterling, Sgt. Edward Kippen of Cleveland, Pvt. Peter Paul Pirant of Cleveland, Pvt. William J. Lash of Willoughby, Pfc. Herbert Herzog of Akron; Sgt. Charles R. Quinn of Dayton; Sgt. Joseph T. Knapp of Fairport Harbor; Hugh Keavey of Cleveland Heights; Pfc. John Dugan of Springfield; Pvt. Arthur L. Holshorst of Mt. Washington, Cincinnati; Pfc. George V. Parrott of Bryan; Lt. Ambrose J. Wangelor of Groveport, and GM 3-c George Tarkamsh of Youngstown.

Most of the relatives were confident MacArthur's troops ultimately would free the Yankee prisoners, but the suddenness of the rescue surprised them.

Dr. Thomas Wanger of Columbus was so surprised to hear that his brother, Lt. Ambrose, was safe that he could say only: "Thank God."

At Cleveland, Pvt. Pirant's sister, Angeline, declared: "I could jump and shout for joy, not for my sake but for the sake of my brother and the rest of the boys liberated."

Mrs. Edna Lash of Willoughby, mother of Pvt. Lash, said "the greatest relief is knowing that he still is alive."

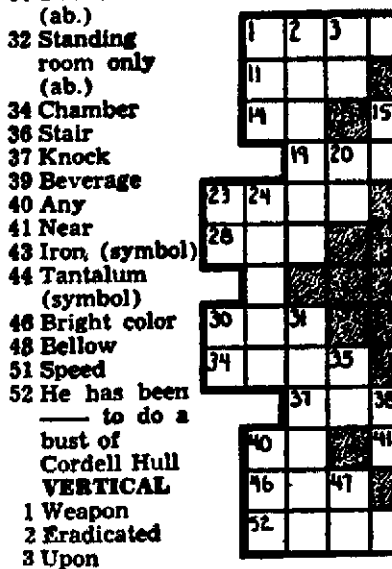
