# Construction May Be No. 1 Post-War Industry

WASHINGTON — The sawing of wood and the driving of nails may be the most familiar noises in America after the war, the Na-tional Post-war Planning assn. tional Post-war said Wednesday.

The construction industry must build as it has never built before in order to contribute its share to peacetime jobs, the association said. It estimates that nearly \$15,-500,000,000 worth of construction must be done after the war. The record to date for construction expenditure was set in 1926 amounted to \$11,000,000,000.
