

The ocean covers two and one-half times as much of the earth's surface as does the land.

When we swim in a lake, the water may be "over our heads' but it is shallow when compared to the ocean. The average depth we can go by boat from the Atlantic to the Pacific around the southern end of South America.

Before the year 1850, men had tested the depth of a few seas and bays, but no one knew how deep the water was out in the ocean. There are gentle slopes in the bottom of a lake, but in general the bottom is fairly smooth. In the ocean, there are great spaces where the bottom has steep slopes. We even may say that the ocean has "hills and valleys." The ocean bottom also has

"mountain peaks." In some places, mountains have sunk below the surface. In other spots, volcanoes have built up cones from the ashes and lava they have sent out.
