DEFIANCE GAS OPERATOR IS SUSPENDED BY OPA

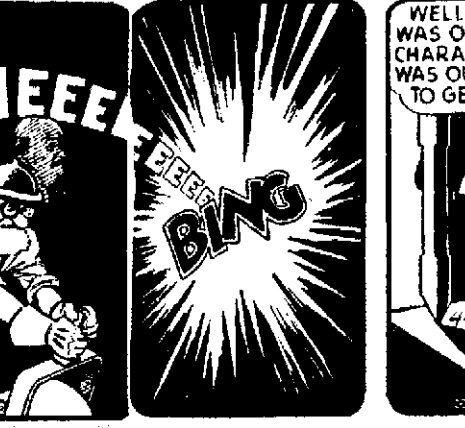
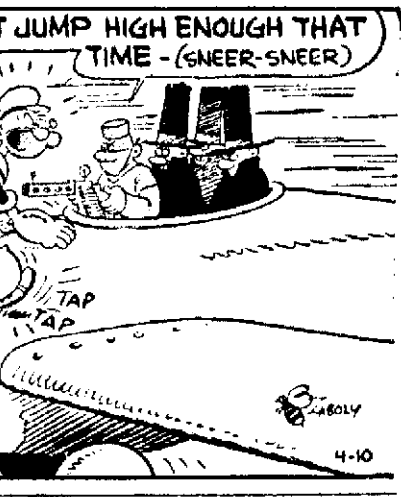
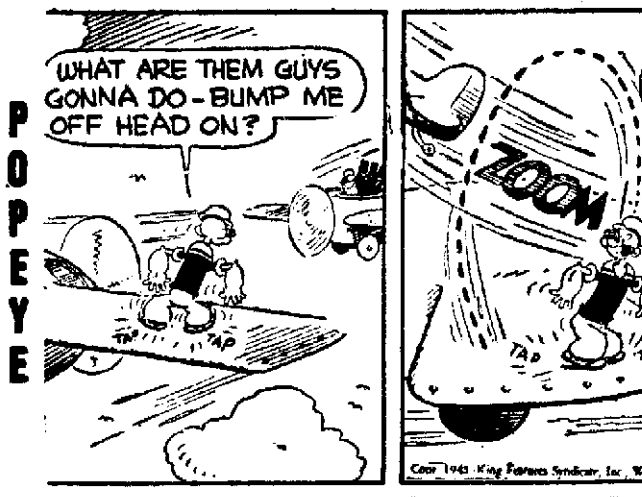
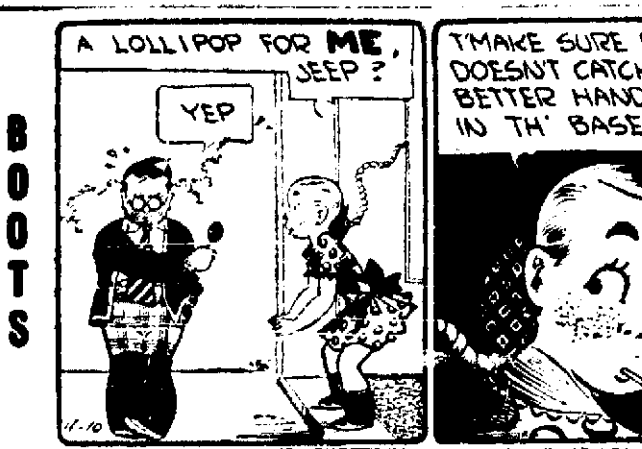

Soldier Loses Prison Appeal

ATLANTA, Apr. 10—(AP)—Hugh Callan, 39-year-old former soldier from The Bronx, New York City, has lost his appeal from a 10-year prison sentence for making uncomplimentary remarks about the President but the U. S. district attorney's office said here today his "whereabouts are unknown." District Attorney M. Neil Andrews said Callan had been at liberty on his own recognizance since a federal court here granted him a writ of habeas corpus last September to free him from the federal penitentiary. The U. S. circuit court of appeals at New Orleans set aside the writ yesterday and ordered the New Yorker remanded to prison.
