# Civilian Plane **Output Started**

ALLIANCE, July 13 - (AP)-Civilian airplanes will be on the market by fall, says the Taylorcraft Aviation Corp.

A two-passenger private model, known as the "Troubadour," already is on assembly lines, the company announced today, adding, full production was expected by September. The two-person, sideby-side standard monoplane, equipped with a 65-horsepower engine, will sell for approximately \$2,295,

Taylorcraft also reported a family sedan-type plane, to be called the "Tourist," should be in full production by December and on the market early next year. A four-passenger ship, it will sell for \$3,550 equipped with a 125horsepower engine and \$4,000 with

a 140-H.P. engine. The company said these planes were being constructed in a branch factory since Taylorcraft's main plant is manufacturing control surfaces for the Douglas A-26 bomber. Eventually, it plans to produce 8,000 to 10,000 planes an-
