Other kinds of wild sundancer, and wold sundancers, and southern Asia also received the seeds, and started growing sunflowers. Along the minds of early settlers, the flower suggested the disk of the sun. Most wild sunflowers have flowers of small or medium size. They may measure three inches across or, in some cases, five or six inches. In gardens, on the other hand, we may find sunflowers as large as dinner plates. A width of 12 inches is fairly common.
