A Stoic was expected to follow certain rules. He was to be brave and truthful. When he met trouble or pain, he was to keep his mind


While Marcus was growing up the great Hadrian was on the throne of the Roman empire. Hadrian took notice of the lad, and called him by a nickname meaning "the most true."


