

# 'My Reputation' Due Friday For Run at Ohio Theatre

A superb love story, tender and heartwarming is the latest film drama, "My Reputation," which opens at the Ohio theatre Friday. Starring Barbara Stanwyck and featuring an impressive company of supporting players including George Brent, Warner Anderson, Lucile Watson, John Ridgely, and Eve Arden, the novel of the same name has been transformed with deftness and understanding, into a deeply moving motion picture.

Against a background of modern suburban society, the picture traces the story of Jessica Drummond, a gracious young widow, who, falling in love for the second time, finds herself the center of a vicious scandal which changes her life and engulfs, as well, the innocent lives of her two young sons.

The relentless and savage fight of a girl to completely monopolize the interest and affection of the man she loves is the dramatic theme of "Leave Her to Heaven," the new film starring Gene Tierney, Cornel Wilde and Jeanne Crain, currently showing at the Quilna theatre.

The story revolves around beautiful Ellen Berent, who wants to be loved as intensely as she, herself loves—and who will stop at nothing, even murder, to achieve what she wants.

Dick Powell will come to the Sigma theatre Saturday in his latest film, "Cornered," in which he plays an even rougher and tougher role than in "Murder My Sweet."

Currently playing at the theatre is "Girl on the Spot" with Lois Collier and Jess Barker. The film is delightfully different because it is not a mystery yarn. The audience sees its murderer committed early in the film, knows who the murderers are, and does not have to be concerned with the motive. The engrossing thing is the suspense of watching the authorities catch up with the killers.

Dennis O'Keefe seems to be the brunt of all the excitement in "Getting Gertie's Garter" currently playing at the State theatre. Fun runs riot in this film and, with a slight touch of suspense added, it turns out to be an uproarious good time for everyone concerned. Sharing the billing is "Daltons" Ride Again, which shows these famous brothers' raid on the town of Coffeyville, Kas. If it's action you want, you'll find it aplenty in this film.

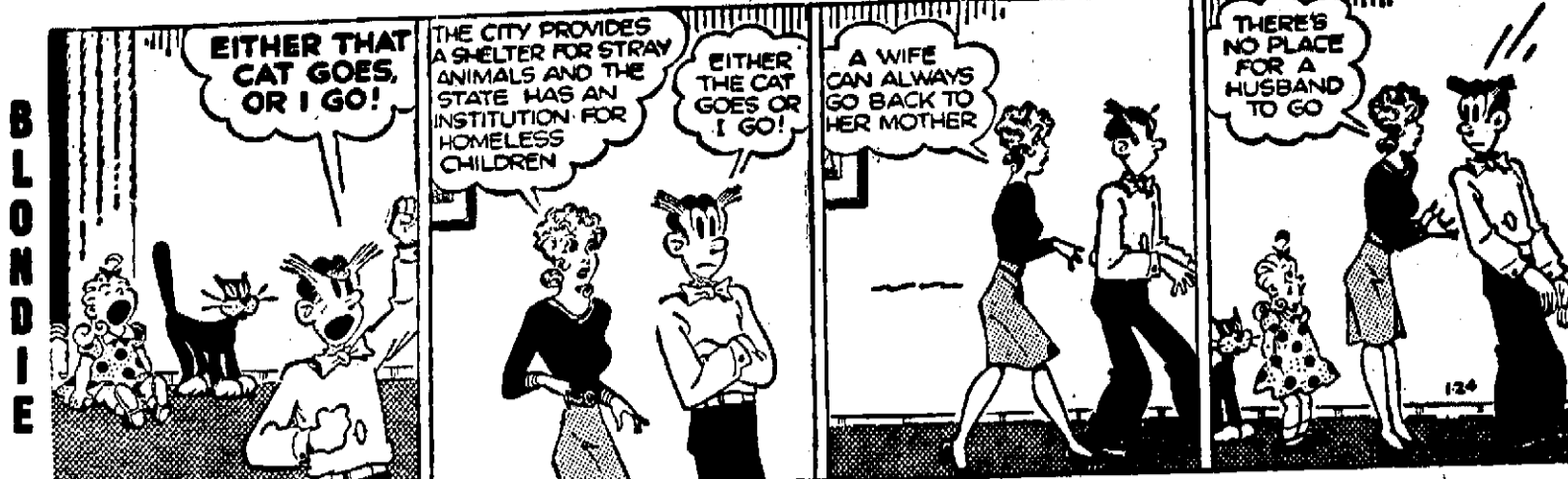
