

Disclosure of Baby Racket In Quilna's Current Feature

A shocking disclosure of the extremes to which racketeers will go to make money is vividly pictured at the Quilna theatre in the film, "Black Market Babies." 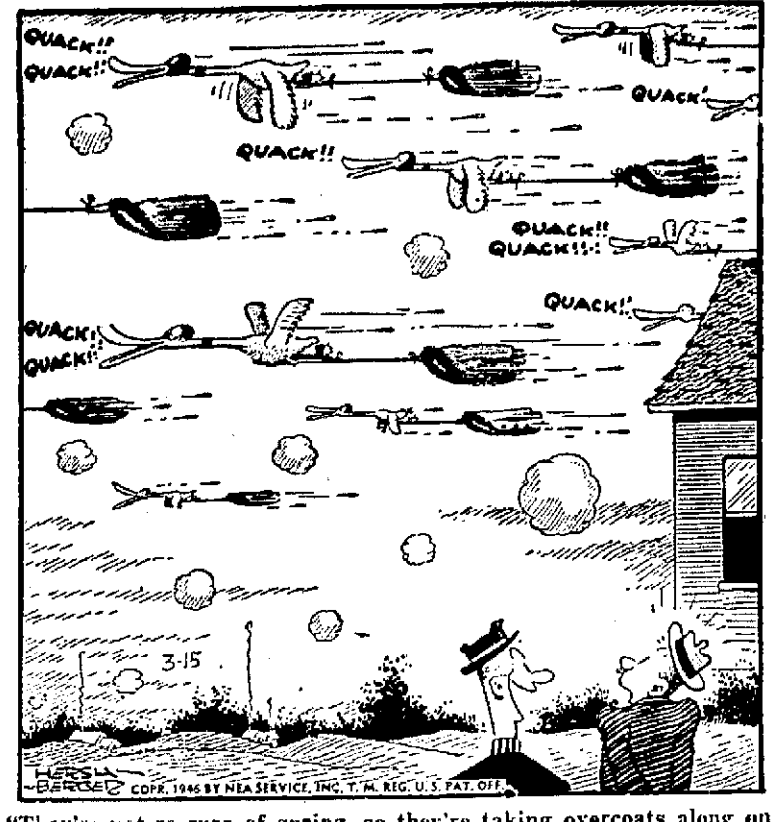

Blasted Dikes Will Be Mended By UNRRA Funds

SHANGHAI, Mar. 15—(INS)—China's rampaging Yellow River sent flooding over two million fertile acres to halt a Japanese army advance in 1938, will be diverted back into its former channel and the flooded areas reclaimed.

This will be done by closing the huge breach in the dikes dynamited by the Chinese army. A train carrying 17 carloads of UNRRA engineering equipment and food is en route to Kaifeng so that work of constructing the dikes can be started before the annual spring-summer floods. Some 330,000 laborers will be employed on the job for six months by the Chinese National Relief and Rehabilitation Administration. Their work will be paid by food supplied

by UNRRA and housing will be provided by CNRRA. Dikes along the 40-mile bed of the river from Chengchow to the Gulf of Chihli are being inspected by UNRRA technicians and the breach between Chengchow and the gulf will be dammed. At present the Yellow river has diverted approximately 45 degrees from its 1938 channel—comparable to the Missouri river breaking at Omaha, Neb., and flooding the wheat lands of western Nebraska and Kansas. It is estimated that the area, when reclaimed, will produce 200 million bushels of grain annually and UNRRA agricultural advisors state the reclamation task is the most important single contribution the organization can make to China's agricultural rehabilitation.
