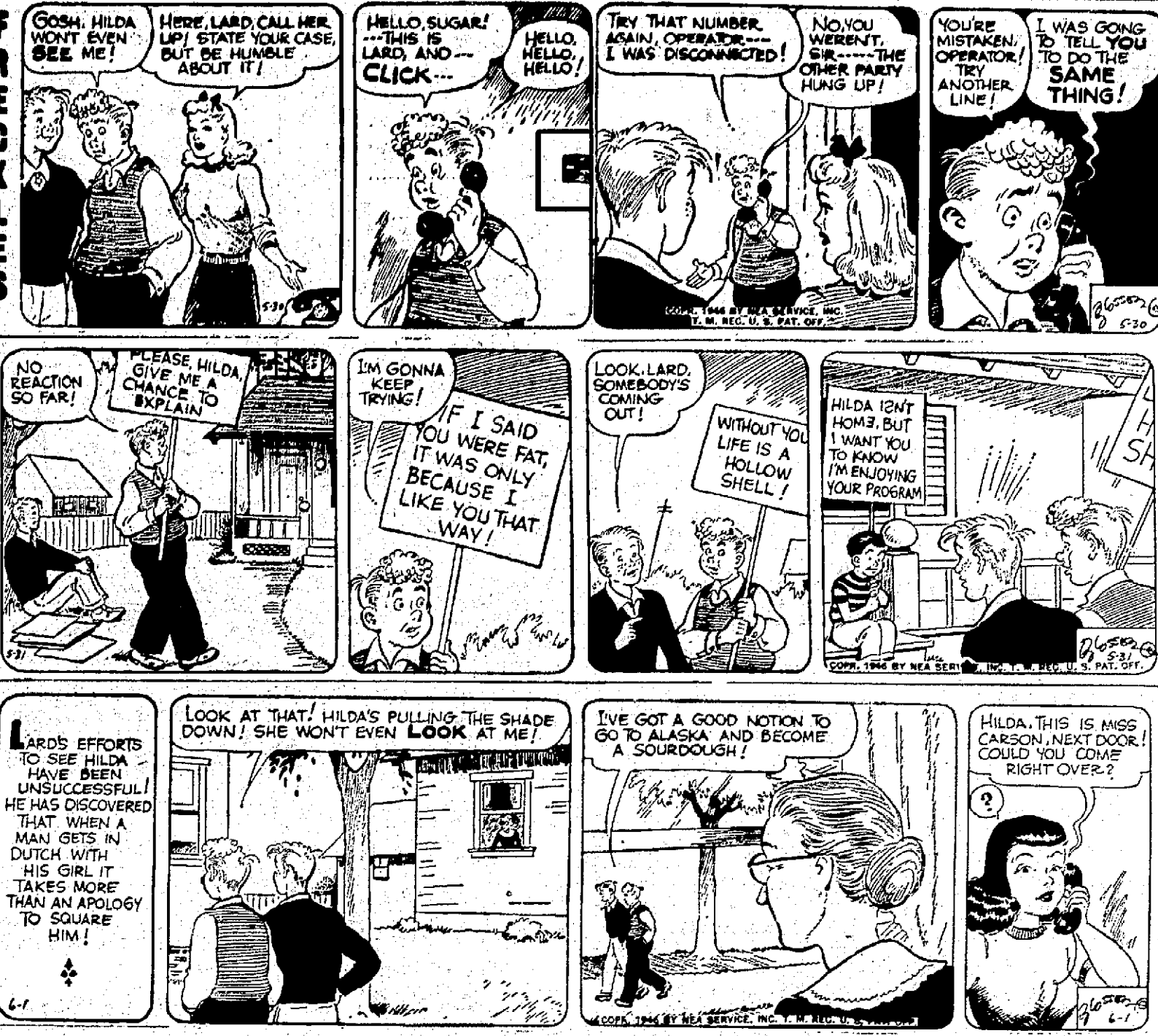

Bus Employes To End Strike

EAST LIVERPOOL, June 1—(AP)—Striking AFL bus drivers will return to work today on the lines of the Valley Motor Transit Co., Mayor Earl Greenwalt announced.

The walkout began 28 days ago, involving 120 drivers and about 45 maintenance men. The concern operates local and inter-city service in an area populated by 140,000 persons, and carries about 45,000 passengers a day.

The mayor declared the return to work was agreed upon when the company said it would absorb the cost of a wage increase of 14 cents an hour until new fares authorized by the city councils of East Liverpool and Steubenville could be approved by the OPA. Drivers formerly received 85 cents an hour and had struck for \$1.20 an hour.

COLUMBUS, June 1—(UP)—The form of a proposed constitutional amendment that would limit use of automobile license and gasoline taxes to highway purposes today received approval of Atty. Gen. Arthur E. Jenkins.

The amendment was sponsored by Walter R. Hamer, James G. Daly and J. Russell Lloyd of Columbus. It must receive 310,000 signatures on initiative petitions to win a place on the November ballot.
