Stories of 2 Generals Are Told

MY THREE YEARS WITH EISENHOWER is an entertaining backstage account of some of the most important leaders and events in World War II. The book comprises the day-to-day diary of Capt. Harry C. Butcher who was assigned as naval aide to Gen. Dwight Eisenhower from 1942 to 1945.

The courage and faith of another great military leader are revealed in Gen. Jonathan Wainwright's account of his four years of fighting on Bataan and Corregidor, of surrender to the Japanese, of grueling months of captivity and of final rescue. His is a heroic, yet grim, story told simply and directly.

If you have ever dreamed of befriending a wealthy reclusive and thereby achieving a fortune, you must meet Gulliver Shiels. Hero of **YOUNG MAN WITH A DREAM**, Gulliver yearned for a South Sea island. His adventures in Dublin waiting for the necessary paperwork form the plot for Kenneth Reddin's light-hearted novel.

An Irish widow suddenly endowed with the ability to foresee events claims attention in Dorothy Macardle's newest novel **THE UNFORESEEN**. Virginia finds her strange power almost unbearable and nearly wrecks her daughter's life because of it. Like **THE UNINVITED**, this excursion into the realms of the psychic will also intrigue and entertain.

It's a gay, glamorous life that Lilly Dache, the French milliner, recalls in her autobiography **TALKING THRU MY HATS**. Miss Dache relates how she left her home in France and came to the United States where persistence brought her fame and fortune.

The world of the ballet, to which the author herself belongs, is vividly depicted in Raya Keen's novel **SHE SHALL HAVE MUSIC**. Financial difficulties force Zina, an American ballet dancer, to abandon her dream of becoming a great ballerina and to join a large corps de ballet. Zina's ambition is finally achieved with the theatre forming a fascinating and dramatic backdrop.

Miss Dorothy Staiger, soprano, will sing "Drink To Me only with Thine Eyes" and the aria "Pace, Pace" from Verdi's opera "Forza del Destino." Col. Robert R. McCormick, editor and publisher of the Chicago Tribune, will be speaker on the program.

Another summer concert will be aired when the St. Louis Municipal Opera Co. broadcasts over CBS at 6 p. m.

Plane Readied For Polar Hop

SEATTLE, Aug. 24—(INS)—A B-29 Super-Fortress, stripped down to a "flying gas tank," was being readied today for an attempted world record hop from Hawaii to Cairo, Egypt, via the North Pole—a distance of 10,000 miles.

Details of the attempted flight were disclosed to newsmen at Seattle by Col. C. S. "Bill" Irvine, of St. Paul, Neb., who will pilot the Super-Fort.

A record take off will be made next week from Oahu with the polar plane creaking under a 74-ton load of 10 crew members, news correspondents and a tankcar load of gasoline.

The Super-Fort will be 27,000 pounds over the maximum designed load built for a B-29.

A new landing gear designed to retract the wheels within nine seconds is expected to help the plane get off the ground in a maximum run of 7,100 feet.

The plane, renamed the "Pacusan," meaning Pacific air command, U. S. Army, is the same B-29 "Dumbo" in which Col. Irvine established the present non-stop record of 8,198 miles from Guam to Washington, D. C. in 35 hours, three minutes last November.
