CHICAGO HAS GUESTS

CHICAGO, (UP)—Chicago will play host to more than 750,000 convention guests during 1947, according to the city's convention bureau. The city attracted only 522,000 convention guests last year.

The bureau based its estimates on 3 super-conventions and several hundred smaller conventions scheduled for the last four months of the year.

A super-convention is one that attracts more than 1,000 out-of-town visitors. Largest of the super-conventions is the National Machine Tool Builders' convention, Sept. 16-20. The bureau estimates that more than 50,000 will attend.

CAB TO REOPEN PROBE INTO N.Y. PLANE CRASH

NEW YORK, Sept. 24—(AP) The Civil Aeronautics Board announced today it will reopen hearings next Tuesday on the crash of an American Airlines experimental plane off LaGuardia Field last Aug. 8 in which three crew members died.

The action followed an announcement Sept. 17 by Queens District Attorney Charles P. Sullivan that a chemical analysis of the bodies of dead crew members indicated they had been drinking before the crash. American Airlines officials have denied the allegation.
