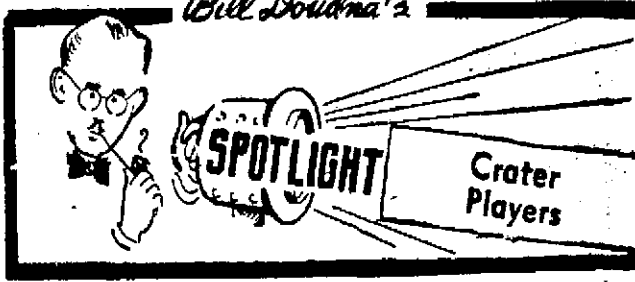

A production of "The Drunkard" which often is hilarious and which frequently takes advantage of its unique setting is being presented by the Crater players at Pleasure Valley, on the outskirts of Blue Mounds. After a brief vacation, the players will resume its frolicking fun at 8 p. m. Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

"The Drunkard," as you probably know, is a temperance play produced first in 1844. It has been revived time and time again, losing its original aspect with the years. For stage managers have changed that lines and actions which a century ago were deadly serious now are laugh-provoking.

The players perform on a stage in a crater. Behind the stage is a pool of water and beyond that the audience sits. Acoustics are so good that the distance is no barrier to clear hearing.

## School Districts Plan 3 Mergers in Sparta Area

SPARTA—The Monroe county school committee will meet at St. Mary's school Thursday to consider the petition of Joint 3, Ridgeville, and Wells district for the dissolution of their district and merger with St. Mary's Bohn and Norwalk districts.

Joint 3 has been closed for some time and under the new school law must attach their school district to an active district or reopen their school. The children are now attending the St. Mary's Bohn and Norwalk districts.

The committee will also give consideration to a similar situation in district No. 2, the Jefferson district. The Jefferson district does not operate its school and students attend the parochial school at Pine Hollow, St. Mary's, and Cashion. Consideration will be given to merge the district with St. Mary's and Cashion where the students are now attending school. No petition has been filed by the Jefferson district.

Thursday, July 15, has been set as the date of the joint meeting of the Jackson and Monroe county school committees at the Melrose high school to plan for an enlarged Melrose district. The area lying in Monroe county, proposed to be annexed to the Melrose district, includes part of the former Stark Valley school district, and all of the Yeske and the West Prairie districts.

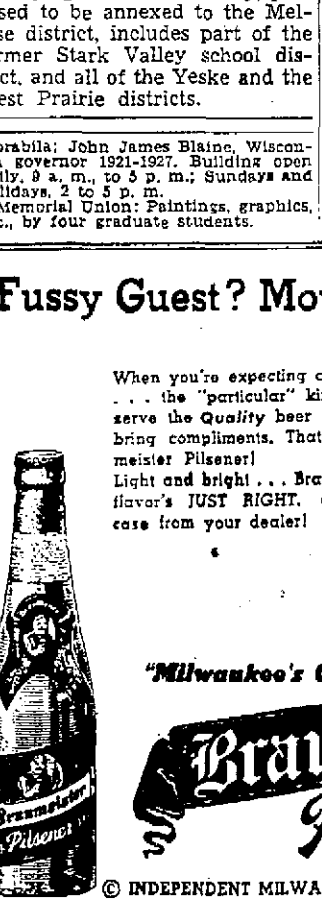

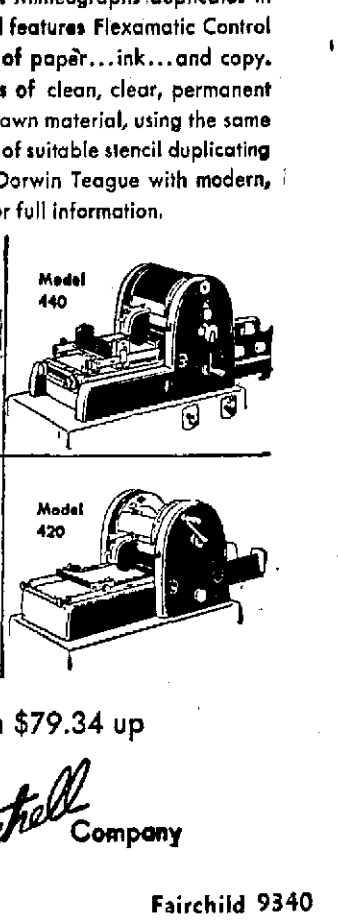
