Krno said he had expected to be recalled to Czechoslovakia, "where I probably would be accused of non-compliance with the present government."

Why we Have TRAFFIC LAWS

It is unlawful for any person to participate in any race or speed endurance with a motor vehicle upon the highway. The purpose of this provision of the Wisconsin traffic code is to protect all users of the highway.

Persons who are inclined to indulge in such races should realize that the law is for their benefit also, for racing on the highway is a foolhardy practice, extremely hazardous for everyone concerned.

A highway race need not be a scheduled or planned affair. It can develop when one driver suddenly decides that he isn't going to let the other fellow pass him. The other fellow then responds to the challenge, and the race is on.

Such persons fail to realize that many highway races have never been won by anybody. In many instances both participants have lost the race, when it ended in court—or in a hospital or morgue.
