

Senate, House Vie for Chairmanship

WASHINGTON, Dec. 25. (AP) A tug-of-war is shaping up over which chamber is entitled to the chairmanship of the joint Congressional economic committee.

That group now is headed by Sen. Taft (R., Ohio). But like all other committees, it will have a Democratic chairman when the new Congress organizes Jan. 3.

As the ranking Democratic member since it was set up under the Congressional Reorganization Act of 1946, Sen. O'Mahoney (Wyo.) had been widely expected to step into Taft's spot.

However, a quiet movement has developed among some House members to insist that either Rep. Hart (N. J.) or Rep. Patman (Tex.) get the assignment.

House Democrats, in that order, although Hart has not yet indicated whether he wants the job. Democratic leaders of the House drive have asked not to be identified publicly at this stage.

English Prelate Tells Peace Aim Strive for Peace

CANTERBURY, Eng., Dec. 25. (AP) Western nations this Christmas season are attempting to establish unity of spirit to meet the challenge of militant atheism, the Archbishop of Canterbury said today.

The archbishop, Dr. Geoffrey Fisher, delivered a Christmas sermon at the Canterbury Cathedral. The defensive effort in the west is causing many to realize that unity of spirit can rest only upon unity of fundamental beliefs, he said.

"The growth of our confidence is not in the emotions of Christ, mass, glorious and uplifting thoughts, but in the faith through which it springs," he said. "It is a faith we hold in confidence not only for our own salvation, but for the deliverance of the world."
