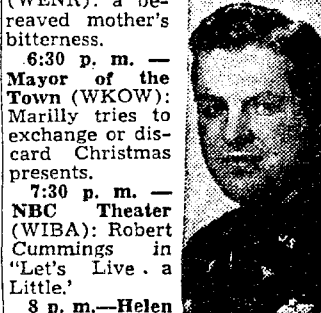

## FCC Sees Spac Shortage on Radio, TV Wave Bands

WASHINGTON—(UP)—The government has warned that it will require more regular use of better scientific techniques to make room for all the radio, television, and short-wave broadcasters who want to be heard or seen.  
A note of alarm was sounded by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) in its 14th annual report on its job of policing the ether.  
The commission said that by mid-1948 there were 131,000 authorized radio stations elbowing each other for room in the spectrum, plus some 150,000 mobile stations such as aeronautical, marine, radar, police, fire, and railroad units.  
Taxicab companies in cities all over the country use about 3,000 stations to speed up service, and about the same number are used in general industry, the FCC said.  
Last year, a Texan wanted a radio license for his diaper pickup service, and a Chicago clemency asked for one to direct funeral cortices.  
The commission said the situation is growing steadily worse as more and more applications pour in from would-be radio and television broadcasters.
