FCC Sees Space Shortage on Radio, TV W ave Bands

WASHINGTON — (U.R) — The government has warned that it known radio spectrum is now bewill require more regulation or better scientific techniques to make room for all the radio, television, and short-wave broadcasters who want to be heard or

The commission said that by mid-1948 there were 131,000 authorized radio stations elbowing each other for room in the spectrum, plus some 150,000 mobile stations such as aeronautical, marine, radar, police, fire, and railroad units.
