Four Pre-Easter Sermons Arranged

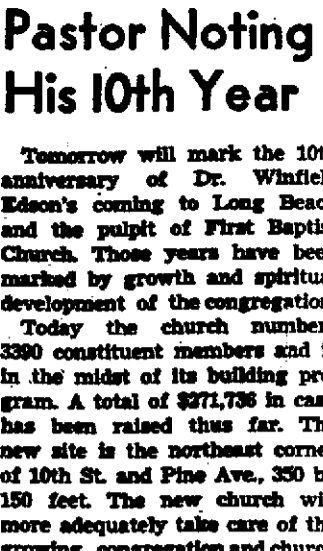

CARE announced yesterday that the last of a backlog of holiday packages purchased by Americans for friends and relatives overseas are en route to their destinations. The delay was caused by a pre-holiday boom of gift-package orders, including 72,500 orders for "turkey-and-trimmin's" Christmas parcels, the nonprofit, government-sponsored relief organization said.

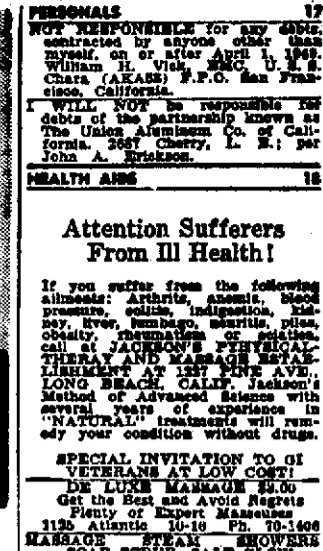
