Conservatism of Women Hampers Their Bridge Play

I put the question, "Do you think women play bridge as well as men?" to Mrs. Arthur Shelgren of Cleveland. We were driving through one of the beautiful sections of Pennsylvania. Shelgren wondered how we could take our minds off the beautiful scenery to discuss a bridge hand. But when his wife said she really did not think that women play as well as men, Shelgren, who is a great admirer of South should jump to six spades over North's bid of three spades. His wife more conserva-tively thought that North should bid four spades instead of three, because three spades indicated control of two suits to her, which North did not have. South then should make the Blackwood bid of four no trump and when North showed one ace with a bid of five diamonds, South would be pretty safe in bidding six spades.

The opening lead of the jack of clubs should be won in dummy with the ace. A diamond won with the ace and a diamond, ruffed. Now a spade led to the ace and another diamond ruffed. A club is led and won with the king. East shows out. What should South do? Should he lead a club, knowing that West has to win the trick and hope that he has the king of hearts? Mrs. Shelgren said that a good woman player will have kept track of the cards. When East shows out on the second club trick it means that West had six clubs. He also has followed to three rounds of diamonds, therefore, he could not have more than four hearts. In fact, if West has another dia-mond, he could hold only three hearts. As East has more hearts than West, he has more chances to hold the king. Therefore, South should play the ace of hearts and then the nine spot. In discussing the bidding of to-day's hand, Shelgren thought Mrs. Shelgren was right. When East wins with the king of hearts he has to lead either a heart or a diamond, allowing South to discard the losing club in one hand and trump in the other.
