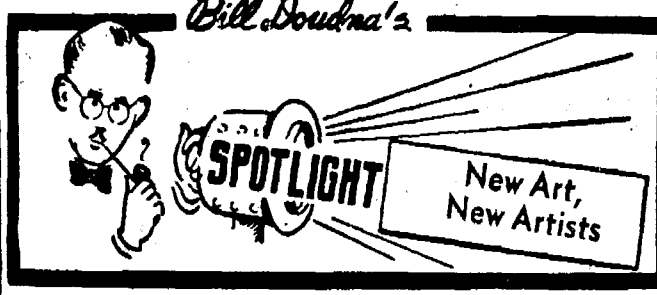

**TIP O' THE MORNING:** Those of you who heard Rise Stevens open the Wisconsin Union concert series (and a lot of other people, too) will be glad to know you can hear her via radio twice within the next few days. She'll be on ABC-WISC in the Metropolitan Opera broadcast Saturday and on NBC-WIBA in the "Concert Hour" Monday night.

Two new members of the art education faculty at the University of Wisconsin made their arrival known emphatically by taking two of the purchase prizes at the 1949 Wisconsin Salon of Art, now on exhibit at the Memorial Union.

Eugene Massin won the Wisconsin Union purchase prize of \$100 and Warrington Colescott received the Union's \$50 purchase prize. Besides giving Colescott a prize, the judges also chose another of his paintings for display in the salon.

Massin's winning oil, "Carousel," was described by the jury as "a painting in which there is a fine sense of movement and life... a unit which has been worked out well within the frame of the picture. By leaving out much detail," the jurors added, "the artist has made the picture speak."

Colescott won his prize with a water color, "Burning Leaves." Of this, the jury said: "A painting which is abstracted from experience but which still holds to experience. The colors, reasonable autumn colors, are well related with the sense of pattern. Autumn color pictures are apt to be just calendar pictures. This one is not."

Colescott came from California, where he had taught two years at Long Beach City college for two years after graduating from the University of California, serving four years in the army, and receiving his master's degree at California.

### Oysters to Be Given Atomic Treatment

BEAUFORT, N. C.—(U.P.)—The Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) and the Fish and Wildlife Service will try to radioactivate oysters here.

The AEC hopes to learn more from the experiment than it did in the A-bomb test at Bikini. The FWS's part in the project will be determining what an oyster likes to eat. In a huge building used before the war as a biological laboratory, the oysters will be fed artificially.

Tiny amounts of radioactive chemical substances from the AEC's isotope division at Oak Ridge, Tenn., will be shot into the tanks along with organisms which scientists believe appeal to an oyster's appetite.

As the organisms grow, they absorb the radioisotopes and the oysters will eat "hot" food. Isotopes can be traced. Thus, said Dr. Clarence Cottam of the FWS, the food taken by the oysters, digested and incorporated in their tissues may be determined chemically and by radiation measurement.
