BEAUFORT, N. C .- (U.P)-The Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) and the Fish and Wildlife Service will try to radioactivate oysters

from the experiment than it did in the A-bomb test at Bikini. The FWS's part in the project will be determining what an oyster likes to eat. In a huge building used before the way as a biological laboratory, the oysters will be fed artificially.

Tiny amounts of radioactive chemical substances from the AEC's isotope division at Oak

Isotopes can be traced. Thus, said Dr. Clarence Cottam of the FWS, the food taken in by the oysters, digested and incorporated in their tissues may be determined chemically and by radiation meas-

Ridge, Tenn., will be shot into the tanks along with organisms which scientists believe appeal to an oyster's appetite.




