Dance Bands Greet New Year

NBC will ring out the old year and greet the new year with the music of more than a dozen top name bands across the country. In New York, Vincent Lopez and his band, playing at the Hotel Taft, will introduce the four-and-one-half hour program. He will be followed by Guy Lombardo. NBC microphones will pick up the traditional crowd celebration in the Times Square area at 11:01 p.m. (CST) for two minutes and then will carry the music of two top orchestras from leading hotels in New York until 11:30 p.m.

Orchestras To Hail '50 Over CBS

Dance Party to Last Four and One-Half Hours

A four-and-one-half hour dance party, with music by 15 name bands, beginning an hour and a half before midnight Saturday and extending three hours into Sunday morning will celebrate the arrival of 1950 over KTSA-CBS (10:30 to 3 a.m.)

The lineup of orchestras, broadcasting from lively and happy New Year's Eve gatherings from coast to coast, includes, in a program appropriately named C.B.S.' "New Year's Eve Dancing Party," those of Frankie Carle, Xavier Cugat, Guy Lombardo, Freddy Martin, Larry Fortine and Ray Robbins.

In addition to fine dance music, the program will offer on-the-spot broadcasts of the rejoicing of New Yorkers in Times Square as the New Year officially arrives, with similar pickups at hour intervals from the Chicago Theater marquee, a Denver hotel, and the intersection of Hollywood Blvd. and Vine St. in Los Angeles.

At intervals throughout the broadcast news bulletins will be aired from the C.B.S. news room in New York.
