Henrik Ibsen's 83-year-old "Peer Gynt" had its American premiere in a new form here Tuesday night and the "Wisconsin Players' production lived up to its advance notices—a remarkable accomplishment.

The "satirical comedy" was presented in a vigorous new translation and with Harold Saeverud's oddly effective score in its first performance in this country, replacing the weary Greek music.

Even with ruthless cutting the drama runs three hours—far too long. The tenuous plot line and repeated excursions into fantasy and philosophy made the three hours seem longer and the tired audience found it difficult to respond to the real poetry of the concluding act.

But otherwise, it is a stunning production of a difficult play. The Players, with warm assistance from many "outsiders," charge into their task with irresistible enthusiasm and conviction that sustains the unwieldy story. Even small tags in interest could have made the undertaking a fiasco but Director Ronald Mitchell keeps the action racing along.

The pace is snappy; the acting excellent; the sets and special effects witty and persuasive.

The technical staff, directed by Fredrick Buerki, had a field day. The meandering story follows Peer from his boyhood through encounters with trolls, international millionaires, dancing girls, and junicats, into his old age—with extensive comments on all.

Birk Eysen undertook the exhausting role of Peer, the dreamy, half-mad wanderer. Merely memorizing the lines was an appalling task—it seems almost unbelievable that he was expected to act, too. But he did, and excellently.

The production is distinguished by a whole galaxy of fine supporting performances.

Notable among them were those of Talie Handier as Peer's spunky mother; Collette Slightman as the remote, lovely Solveig; Edwin Reynolds as the troll king; Leah Mandel as the not-so-dumb Anitra; Warren Enters as the di-
