JACOBY ON CANASTA

Freeze Pack to Shut Out Foes

By OSWALD JACOBY. "I have only just begun to play canasta," writes a Milwaukee correspondent, "and perhaps for that reason I have difficulty in understanding the reason for freezing the pack. "When you discard a deuce or a joker, you are parting with a very valuable card. It strikes me that you never go back anything of comparable value. "If you eventually get the frozen pack, it is true you get your wild card back, but you have not had the use of it in the meantime. This is like putting money in the bank and getting it back after a while without interest. "If the opponent gets your wild card with it, too, this is like putting your money in a bank that falls. "I suppose, since there is so much talk about freezing the pack, that there must be some advantage in doing it. Would you be good enough to explain what the advantage is? "The reason you sometimes discard a deuce or a joker is that you want to prevent the opponents from getting the discard pile. Since the whole game is essentially a struggle for the discard pile, it is highly advantageous to shut the opponents out. "This does not mean, however, that it is a good idea to freeze the pack at an old time. It is foolish to discard one of your wild cards if the opponents have an excellent chance to win the frozen pack. To use my correspondent's comparisons, it's a good idea to invest your wild

Costa Ricans Recover Gems

SAN JOSE, Costa Rica, June 5. Costa Ricans have recovered the golden mantle and precious gems stolen May 12 from the statue of their sacred patron saint—the Virgin of the Angels. Det. Chief Maj. Jorge Pacheco said the jewels had been recovered near Cartago, 20 miles southeast of San Jose, and that the presumed thieves had been arrested. He said details of the case would be disclosed today. Costa Ricans were jubilant when Maj. Pacheco made the announcement last night. The seven-inch black stone image and its adornments were stolen from the basilica at Cartago by thieves who slew the church watchman. The statue itself was found May 20 in the upper roof pulpit of the basilica. Estimates of the gems' value have ranged from \$150,000 to nearly \$1,000,000.
